Buzz Ramsey

***“Steelhead Techniques That Work” @ The Indoor Steelhead River
“Spring Chinook Methods That Work”***

Fishing Hall of Famer Buzz Ramsey brings his steelhead angling basics to the Steelhead River in two seminars. One of the show's most popular pros, he plans to demonstrate techniques including drift, float and side drifting. He will introduce anglers to new products such as the Maxi Jig with its super strong, 2X hooks and the new Maxi Float. Ramsey also anticipates introducing fans to Yakima Bay's new series of how-to videos.

Ron Hobbs

“Smallmouth Bass Fishing in Washington” and “Largemouth Bass Fishing in Washington” @ The Warm Water Seminar Series and Demo Tank

For those intrigued with regional bass fishing, the show hosts one of the top bass pros in the U.S.--Ron Hobbs. His “Smallmouth Bass Fishing in Washington” demonstrations will arm anglers with the techniques and product suggestions to get them started. Focusing on inland waters such as Lakes Washington and Sammamish, he will discuss fish jigs, dropshotting and reaction bait. In his accompanying presentation, “Largemouth Bass Fishing in Washington,” Hobbs will discuss how different bait works for the variety of cover seen in Washington State, including lay downs, milfoil, docks, tules and willows.

Don Simonson

“Basic Fly Casting” and “Advanced Fly Casting” @ The Indoor Steelhead River

One of the gurus of fly fishing, Don Simonson returns to the Steelhead River to coach both beginners and more advanced anglers in the art of fly casting. A certified fly casting instructor

and board member of the Federation of Fly Fishers (FFF), Simonson's basic seminar is aimed at people who don't know anything about fly casting. He will demonstrate the process of presenting the fly to the fish; "I start at ground zero and teach the basic casting stroke."

In "Advanced Fly Casting" Simonson demonstrates techniques aimed at enhancing anglers' ability. He will show how to cast in all planes, obtain accuracy, presentation and extending the line.

Glen Berry
"Elk Hunting Techniques"

Glen Berry's seminar is designed to teach novices and even expert archers how to hunt elk on public lands. During his video presentation using the "Thunder Bugle" and the "Sleazy Cow Call," Berry demonstrates how to locate, call and shoot a bull elk. He will also introduce his latest DVD release, "Elk Hunter's Training Day," which spotlights his tips and techniques for tracking elk.

Scott Haugen
"Steelhead Bank Fishing" @ The Indoor Steelhead River
"Trophy Blacktails," "Spring Turkey Tactics" and "Spring Black Bear Tactics"

Biologist, professional sportsman and show headliner, Scott Haugen returns to Puyallup to share his academic knowledge and in-the-field experience on four of his most popular topics. Those who attend "Trophy Blacktails" will learn about the big bucks' year round behavior with a focus on rattling during October and November. Haugen will demonstrate how to call using synthetic antlers, a rattle bag and real antlers. During his "Steelhead Bank Fishing" presentation on the Steelhead River, Haugen takes a comprehensive look at different bank methods for catching steelhead. He plans to share tips on how to read water as well as take a look at gear options from drifting and lures to bobbers and jig fishing.

When it comes to talking turkey, Haugen will share "Spring Turkey Tactics" when he describes bird behavior in the spring and which calling techniques and approaches work. Haugen is currently writing a new book, "*Western U.S. Turkey Hunting*," and plans to share hard-earned tips about his aggressive style of hunting with either bow or shotgun. During "Spring Black Bear Tactics," Haugen will focus on effective ways to hunt and trophy-judge them. He notes that bear are the toughest animals to judge how big they are due to their long fur and physical features. In his seminar, he hopes to coach hunters to accurately judge the size of a bear so they are shooting mature bears.

Mike Jenkins
"Archery Elk Hunting" and "Rifle Elk Hunting"

Jenkins says his entire focus with "Archery Elk Hunting" is to show participants how to scout and how to be a better hunter. During the archery seminar, he describes pre-season scouting, gear, first aid, different stages of the rut, different hunting techniques such as glassing (using binoculars), calling appropriate to different stages of the rut, spotting and stalking. He walks guests through the field care process of following the blood trail, finishing the kill and how to field dress the elk--even in warm weather.

In "Rifle Elk Hunting," Haugen discusses effective weapons, including elk calibers and equipment for hunting. This seminar focuses on how and when to scout and find elk. He will also coach guests on how to read signs, capitalize on optics, and identify signs of elk and their habitat after rut.

Tom Nelson

"Reading Water" @ The Indoor Steelhead River

"Dirty Downrigger Tricks," "Triple Threat Salmon Angling" and "San Juan Salmon"

"Reading water is defined as the ability to observe and predict where to find the fish," says popular show speaker Tom Nelson. With that goal in mind, the founder of Salmon University and radio host on "The Outdoor Line" on ESPN 710 AM aims to teach showgoers the fundamentals of reading water on the show's Indoor Steelhead River and how to apply those basics to larger rivers.

During "Dirty Downrigger Tricks," Nelson extols the virtues of downriggers. He explains that these "fancy sinkers" give very accurate depth control in terms of the bottom and water column if anglers pay attention to what their fishfinders say. He teaches how to use the information and understand that fish are at a certain depth for a reason. This year's seminar "Triple Threat Salmon Angling" once again looks at conditions that indicate whether to mooch, troll or jig.

A fan of "San Juan Salmon Fishing," Nelson encourages newcomers and veteran anglers to fish this beautiful, unique and challenging salmon area.

Bob Kratzer

"Advanced Plugging for Salmon & Steelhead" @ The Indoor Steelhead River

"Alternative Steelhead Baits"

Most anglers use salmon eggs when they go steelhead fishing, but Bob Kratzer shows how to use other types of bait in his seminar "Alternative Steelhead Baits." For example, he will teach how to cure prawns and squid and rig them for bait as well as the use of artificial baits. He highlights the availability of these alternatives in his presentation.

In the "Advanced Plugging for Salmon & Steelhead" seminar on the Steelhead River, Kratzer will focus on the lost art of advanced tuning techniques for lures. He observes that lures do not come out of the package ready to "run true." Kratzer will demonstrate some of his tips on how to apply silicone or epoxy to lures to give them a different action. During this seminar, he will also demonstrate two techniques on how to use plugs from the bank.

Marc Marcantino

"Advanced Dropshotting Techniques," "Crankbaits and Jerkbaits" and "Frogs, Alabama Rigs and other Big Bass Techniques" @ The Warm Water Seminar Series and Demo Tank

In his seminar "Advanced Dropshotting Techniques," Marc Marcantino demonstrates how to use dropshotting techniques in unique ways in abnormal situations. For example, he will show how to use a horizontal technique that uses large plastic bait that he and Ron Hobbs created called "dropswimming."

During “Crankbaits and Jerkbait,” Marcantino will talk about the use of baits in relation to seasonal considerations--as well as the equipment needed to throw properly and also how to *land* more fish.

New to the show, his “Frogs, Alabama Rigs and Other Big Bass Techniques” will demonstrate how to use soft, hollow-bodied, plastic frogs and a modified umbrella lure called an Alabama Rig. Marcantino explains that it is important to learn how to manipulate the floating frogs to attract bass strikes.

“It’s just fun to fish with fake frogs,” says Marcantino, “And it’s a very successful technique.”

Jack and Brandon Glass

“Columbia River Spring Chinook Fishing” and “Catch More Fish with Side-Imaging”

Jack Glass of “Team Hook-Up” and his son, Brandon, will share trolling herring, rigging techniques and other secrets during their “Columbia River Spring Chinook Fishing” seminar. During the “Catch More Fish with Side-Imaging” seminar, the duo covers these electronics—which can improve a catch by as much as 20 percent. In the presentation they will show seminar attendees how to identify what they are seeing when utilizing this technology.

Aaron Burkhart

“Mule Packing for Beginner & Advanced” @ The Mule Packing Demonstration Area

After discussions and demonstrations, Aaron Burkhart promises to give show attendees the opportunity to practice packing on a live mule and horse. This hands-on experience demonstrates the importance of balancing loads. Burkhart, a former Washington State Packing Champion, shares how much weight a mule can pack and how to balance it, and packing of wild game meat after backcountry hunts. Packing safety—on and off the trail—is emphasized in these fun and informative presentations.

Joaquin and Donna Quezada

Ice Sculpting demo (Saturday only)

Though he’s known for his chainsaw carving demonstrations at the show, Joaquin Quezada is also one of the top ice sculptors in the nation. Saturday only at the show, he’ll carve a spectacular sculpture from a block of ice in a demonstration for showgoers. 2012 “Head & Horns” spotlights full-body big game mounts, on-site scoring of show attendee’s trophies and sales of new big game record books

PUYALLUP—Big game trophies, including three eye-popping full-body big game mounts, on-site scoring of trophies submitted by show attendees, and new books devoted to the record-setting Northwest big game trophies headline the 2012 “Head & Horns” display and competition at the Washington Sportsmen’s Show (www.thesportshows.com), January 25-29 at the Puyallup Fair and Events Center.

New to the “Head & Horns” are three full-body big game trophies, including a world record American bison taken in South Dakota. At 2,100 pounds and standing 6-foot 4-inches at the hump, this outstanding specimen is joined by a 400-pound black bear, 200-pound mountain lion and 16 head and horn big game mounts. Prizes are awarded for all three methods of harvest: rifle, archery and black powder. The top entries from each of the categories will be on display throughout the show and the entry deadline for the competition is 8:00 pm Saturday, Jan. 28. “It’s always exciting to see the mounts local hunters bring to the show and how they score. The display of entries brought to the show evolves daily as new mounts are added,” said display and competition organizer David Morris. He said an impressive new addition for this year will be the new Washington State record California bighorn sheep.

His popular *“Record Book for Washington’s Big Game Animals”* (third edition) will also be on sale at the display.

A lifetime outdoorsman, guide and former taxidermist, Morris observes that achieving a record relates to luck, persistence and selectivity.

“The Head & Horns competition and display promotes hunting to harvest mature animals,” says Morris. “Our hunters are respectful of game as a renewable resource and utilize as much of each harvest as possible.”
